Reflect: Decide what to do

Friday 3rd October is CAFOD's Harvest Fast Day - a day when CAFOD asks us to give up a little of what we usually eat on that day, a snack or treat, and instead give the money to help those who don't have enough to eat.

This week we will be having a fairtrade tuck shop where you can buy a product that has been produced fairly with all the contributors getting paid the right wage for their work.

And if you're asking yourself, "Why should I?" – imagine this...

You are one of 8 brothers and sisters. all different, with very different personalities but all trying to get along. Each night you sit down around the table for your meal and your eldest sister is given most of the food, one of your brothers is also given a lot, but you and the other younger ones at the bottom of the table, well, you are given very little, one brother just has to cope with bread and salt. You can see how unfair this is. You KNOW that there is enough food in the house for everyone and yet every night at least one of your brothers and sisters goes hungry.

This is what happens in YOUR family, MY family, OUR global family every day. There is enough in our world for EVERYONE to eat yet many go hungry every day. Let's join together this week to make a difference!

How can you join the fight to make the distribution of food a fair one?

Luke 17:5-10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Make our faith greater." The Lord answered, "If you had faith as big as a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Pull yourself up by the roots and plant yourself in the sea!' and it would obey you. "Suppose one of you has a servant who is ploughing or looking after the sheep. When he comes in from the field, do you tell him to hurry along and eat his meal? Of course not! Instead, you say to him, 'Get my supper ready, then put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink; after that you may have your meal.' The servant does not deserve thanks for obeying orders, does he? It is the same with you; when you have done all you have been told to do, say, 'We are ordinary servants; we have only done our duty.""
