## Scripture

Acts 22: 3 -16

"I am a Jew, born in Tarsus in Cilicia, but brought up here in Jerusalem as a student of Gamaliel. I received strict instruction in the Law of our ancestors and was just as dedicated to God as are all of you who are here today. I persecuted to the death the people who followed this Way. I arrested men and women and threw them into prison. The High Priest and the whole Council can prove that I am telling the truth. I received from them letters written to fellow Jews in Damascus, so I went there to arrest these people and bring them back in chains to Jerusalem to be punished.

"As I was travelling and coming near Damascus, about midday a bright light from the sky flashed suddenly around me. I fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to me, 'Saul, Saul! Why do you persecute me?' 'Who are you, Lord?' I asked. 'I am Jesus of Nazareth, whom you persecute,' he said to me. The men with me saw the light, but did not hear the voice of the one who was speaking to me. I asked, 'What shall I do, Lord?' and the Lord said to me, 'Get up and go into Damascus, and there you will be told everything that God has determined for you to do.' I was blind because of the bright light, and so my companions took me by the hand and led me into Damascus.

"In that city was a man named Ananias, a religious man who obeyed our Law and was highly respected by all the Jews living there. He came to me, stood by me, and said, 'Brother Saul, see again!' At that very moment I saw again and looked at him. He said, 'The God of our ancestors has chosen you to know his will, to see his righteous Servant, and to hear him speaking with his own voice. For you will be a witness for him to tell everyone what you have seen and heard. And now, why wait any longer? Get up and be baptised and have your sins washed away by praying to him.'



**Reflect:** Instead of the usual Sunday Gospel reading this scripture passage is taken from this coming Saturday's Mass— the Feast of our Saint - Paul—and his conversion. This is a really significant celebration for us as a community because it marks the time when this man, who was known as Saul, had an encounter with Christ that made him change his ways. He put his past behind him, took on a new name (Paul) and started a new way of living. Read the passage - his own words tell us "I persecuted to the death the people who followed this way". Saul was a violent and menacing man towards Christians and yet he was chosen to be such

a special, significant figure in Christianity. This Feast reminds us all that it's never too late with God, he calls us all, whatever our past, to start again with him.

- Which areas of your life need to change? How?

- people who need the courage to start again.
- the courage to give people a second chance.

- Turn your back on a bad habit.
- Try to start again with someone who hurt you.
- See the good in people.
- Make a new start

From then on he saw things differently, he changed. He became known as Paul and decided to walk a different path.

Conversion: Saw the light

Turned over a new leaf

Changed direction

Took a different path

Started again

Can you think of any more? Which word or phrase is the one that speaks the most to you? Do any of them apply to you and your life right now?

Dear Lord, you met Paul as he travelled along the road to Damascus, meet me as I travel through this day.

It was by meeting you that Paul had the courage to let go of his past and begin a new way of life - I'd like to do that Lord!

Help me to let go of the things that have been holding me back so that I can begin anew, with you, today!

As we grow and change, be with us, especially when things feel strange and different.

Help us, wherever we can, to walk in the footsteps of your son Jesus Christ.
