## Matthew 3:13-17

Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John. But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptised by you, and do you come to me?" Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfil all righteousness." Then John consented.

As soon as Jesus was baptised, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

**Reflect:** Yesterday in church we celebrated the feast of the Baptism of the Lord, the last official day of Christmastide. Today the time known as 'Ordinary Time' begins in the church calendar.

Friday marks the start of an 8 day period where Christians are encouraged to pray for Christian Unity. Perhaps this week it is useful to remind ourselves that Christianity is the umbrella under which sit all the different 'spokes' of Christian communities. If I am a Catholic, I am a Christian Catholic; if I am a Methodist, I am a Christian Methodist; if I am an Anglican, I am a Christian Anglican. As Catholics, Anglicans, Methodists etc we are not outside of the main 'label' we all have as Christians, nor are one group of Christians superior to any other. We have so much more in common than things we differ on!

Often in life it is easier to focus on what is different about things, places, people, communities but we usually find that there is far more we hold in common. St Paul reminded us that we are all parts of the one body, whatever we look like, sound like, however we pray.
