## A Future Not Our Own

It helps, now and then, to step back and take the long view. The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is beyond our vision. 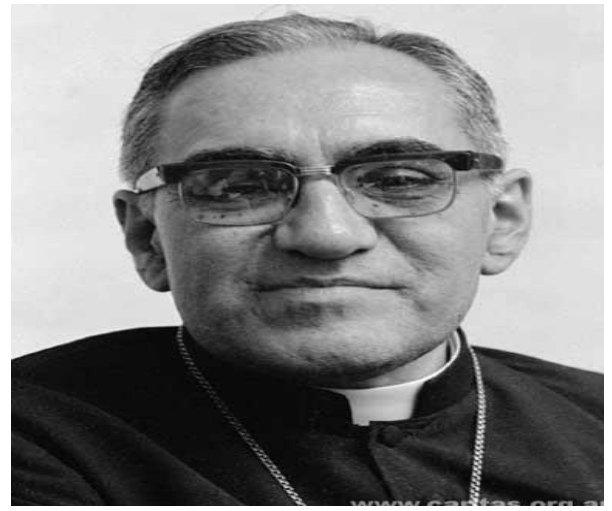
Today we are inspired by Romero's words: "It is not God's will for some to have everything and other to have nothing." We bring to Jesus those in our global family who do not have what they need.
